

**PROPOSAL
MANCHESTER BUSINESS SCHOOL WORLDWIDE COLLABORATION
WITH THE
JAMAICA INSTITUTION OF ENGINEERS**

BACKGROUND

The Jamaica Institution of Engineers (JIE) exists to promote and encourage the general advancement of the Engineering profession, the practice and science of Engineering, and to facilitate the exchange of information and ideas among the members of the Institution and its public.

The Manchester Business School Worldwide, offers an MBA which consists of an Engineering stream which caters to Engineering Business Managers, has developed a relationship with the Jamaica Institution of Engineers through its Caribbean Centre. In order to ensure professional development of its membership, discussions have been held between both Institutions to ensure a mutually beneficial relationship.

ABOUT MANCHESTER BUSINESS SCHOOL WORLDWIDE

The Manchester School of Business was founded in 1965 and was the first UK institution to offer an MBA programme. Surveys in the London Financial Times consistently rank the School in the top ten in Europe and particularly highlight the School's excellent research capacity, its international mix of students and the salary progression of MBA graduates. It is highly ranked internationally.

The degree awarded by the University of Manchester/Manchester Business School and that awarded to the distance-learning students is exactly the same as that awarded to full-time residential students.

The programme is being administered in Jamaica through its Caribbean Centre, The Jamaica Institute of Bankers which is located at 39 Hope Road, Kingston.

Discount Package

- MBSW will provide a 20% discount on the taught element of the programme (see fee structure below) to members of JIE, provided that there are at least 20 members who have applied and approved to pursue the Engineering Stream per intake;
- If this condition is not met, the students will pay the regular rate
- This offering will be in July each year, commencing July 2010

JIE will:

- Obtain at least 20 students per semester, commencing July 2010
- Use available resources to promote the programme among its membership

Timing

The programme is normally offered over a period of three years, with 2 ½ years for the taught element and 6 months for the project stage.

Investment/Cost

The current cost of the programme is £21,000 which is paid on a semesterly (see below fee structure) with a 20% discount to JIE members.

Scholarship Package

The Scholarship

- ❖ Scholarship award will be 50% of the total fee which is currently £21,000, (excluding project fee of £2000)
- ❖ Award is offered for 2010 July semester and cannot be deferred

Eligibility

Candidate must:

- ❖ Be a member of the Jamaican Institution of Engineers
- ❖ Have at least a first degree or 5 years substantial work experience
- ❖ Meet the matriculation requirements of the Manchester Business School Worldwide
 - have relevant work experience as per MBA requirement
- ❖ Not be the holder of an MBA degree
- ❖ Not be the beneficiary of any other scholarship/grant

Performance

- ❖ Candidate's academic performance will be monitored and reviewed each semester before the required payment is disbursed to Manchester Business School Worldwide
- ❖ Candidate must maintain at least a passing grade

Application Process

- ❖ Expression of interest should be submitted to the Jamaica Institution of Engineers via an application form which will be provided
- ❖ Apply for the MBA for Engineering Business Managers by visiting <http://www.mbs-worldwide.ac.uk>

- ❖ The JIE will do a short-list of applicants considered eligible for the scholarship who will then be asked to:
 - Submit an essay of no more than 1500 words, no later than June 5, 2006 addressed to the President, Jamaican Institution of Engineers entitled “*As an engineer how will an MBA help my Career Development*”
 - Be available to attend an interview
 - Successful candidates will be informed in writing by 2006 June 12
