- Construction For Building & Engineering Works designed by the Employer RED BOOK 1999 Edition
- Plant & Design Build For Electrical and Mechanical Plant and for Building & Engineering Works designed by the Contractor YELLOW BOOK 1999 Edition
- Design Build & Turnkey ORANGE BOOK 1995 Edition
- EPC Turnkey Design & Build SILVER BOOK 1999 Edition

- Short Form –
  GREEN BOOK 1999 Edition
- DBO Design Build and Operate GOLD BOOK 2007 Edition
- MDB Construction Contract amended for Multi-Lateral Development Banks
   RED BOOK MDB 2005 Edition

## **BASIS FOR CONTRACTS**

- Method of Procurement not the nature of the Construction Works
- Responsibilities / Risks assumed by Employer and the Contractor

## **STANDARDISED CONTRACTS**

- Applicable to wide range of Building, Engineering and Construction Works.
- Same words and definitions used in different contracts.
- Core of common conditions.
- Amendments allowed in incorporation of PARTICULAR CONDITIONS (PART II). (Ensure that no conflict emerges between General & Particular and between new clauses in Particular).
- BE WARY OF NEW CONTRACTS FORMULATED FROM SCRATCH or by HYBRIDIZATION.

### **STANDARDISED CONTRACTS**

- Attractive for Global utilisation:
  - (a) Experience gathered in court cases, arbitrations over the years. The First Edition of the RED BOOK was in 1957.
  - (b) Updating of contracts based on ongoing seminars, discussions etc., between FIDIC, Banks, Governments, Contractors, etc.
  - (c) Clarity of clauses Number of clauses reduced in RED BOOK, now only 20 versus original 70+.

#### GREEN BOOK – SHORT FORM OF CONTRACT

- Short Form
- Simple Works
- Short Durations
- No Specialist Sub-contractors
- Employer's Design or Contractor's Design or Mix
- Employer acts as Engineer
- Rules for Adjudication

#### <u>RED BOOK – WORKS DESIGNED BY EMPLOYER</u>

- Employer's Design
- Allows for Contractor's Design
- Value Engineering
- Engineer employed by Employer
- DAB Dispute Adjudication Board
- Arbitration

#### • RED BOOK MDB – MODIFICATION FOR BANKS

- Participating Banks in Contract Preparation include:
  - African Development Bank
  - Asian Development Bank
  - Caribbean Development Bank
  - European Bank for Reconstruction & Development
  - Inter-American Development Bank
  - The World Bank
- Reduces amendments in Part II

- YELLOW BOOK WORKS DESIGNED BY CONTRACTOR
  - Design by Contractor
  - Employer's Requirements are part of the Contract Documents
  - Engineer employed by the Employer
  - DAB
  - Arbitration

- ORANGE BOOK DESIGN & BUILD
  - Contractor Design
  - Utilized in Turnkey Contracts
  - Employer's Requirements
  - Operation by Contractor for limited time as in BOT.

- SILVER BOOK –
  ENGINEERING PROCUREMENT & CONSTRUCTION
  - EPC / Turnkey Projects.
  - All risks for time, cost, ground conditions, accuracy of Employer's Requirements and quality transferred to the Contractor.
  - Employer retains risk for war, social conditions and Force Majeure
  - NO ENGINEER

- GOLD BOOK DESIGN, BUILD & OPERATE
  - DBO
  - Similar to SILVER BOOK
  - Long Term Operations
  - Contractor has no responsibility for financing or commercial

### **CONSULTANT'S REQUIREMENTS REGARDING APPLICATION OF FIDIC**

- Understand Scope of Works
- Allocate Risks / Responsibilities
- Recommend appropriate Form of Contract
- Know the different Forms of Contract
- Administer the works in accordance with the Contract.
- Aid not Substitute for good Contract Administration.
